## Archbishop Desmond Tutu

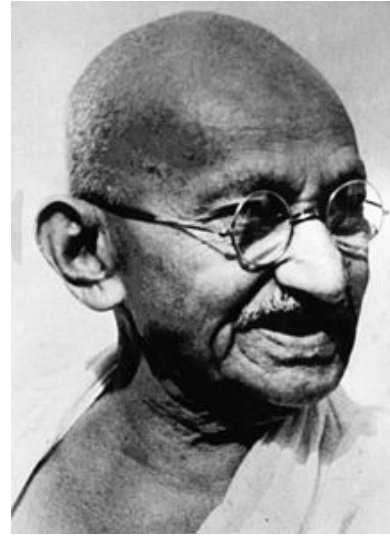
